Inauguration of Talent Development Centre at Challakere

The Inaugural function of Talent Development Centre was held on February 26, 2011 at Challakere Campus – Chitradurga District. It was a very significant and historic event of IISc.

The welcome address and information about the second campus was given by Prof. B.N. Raghunandan, Divisional Chairman, Centre for Earth & Environmental Sciences. The Chief Guest, Sri B.S. Yeddyurappa, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, Inaugurated the Centre. Prof. P. Balaram, Director, Indian Institute of Science, addressed the gathering. Sri N.Y. Gopala Krishna, Hon'ble MLA, Molakalmuru, presided over the function and Sri G. Karunakara Reddy, Hon'ble Minister for Revenue and District-in-charge, Govt. of Karnataka, was the Distinguished Guest.



The newly launched Talent Development Centre (TDC) will not only benefit teachers in Chitradurga, but it will also be the Science Hub of the future, said Professor P. Balaram, Director, IISc. "Teachers across the state will be trained in a residential training programme and their skills will be updated so that science education reaches grass root levels. Apart from which an energy research centre and a water resources engineering centre are on the anvil. Also in the pipeline is a synchrotron, (a high energy electron accelerator) over a 100 acre area within the campus, which will attract researchers not only from the country but from across the world" – the Director elaborated about the centre. Thanking Yeddyurappa for agreeing to allocate funds for the 1 MW solar power project in the campus, Prof. Balaram termed science



and technology as the key driver in the development of the country, during the speech he also recollected the development of IISc and the long journey of the premier institution.

The focus of the Talent Development Centre (TDC) would be to train high school teachers of science stream in 10 batches and each batch will have 100 trainees. The first batch of trainees were from Chitradurga. All the teachers of other districts of the state will be trained in phases. The teachers of the first batch were thrilled by the programme and the response was overwhelming. Two teachers were applauded for the best maintenance of laboratory manual during the 10 day training programme. They also expressed their desire to visit the lab as often as possible preferably with their students and show them what they should do.

This meeting is expected to serve as a fantastic starting point for future collaborative efforts between IISc and GE. This has also motivated Alumni Cell to work closely with other organizations/industries in bringing the Alumni to the campus for mutual benefit.

Contributions from Alumni :

Donation (US\$ 3000.00) received by Alumni cell from Dr. Arkal Shenoy and Dr. Vasanthi Shenoy through IISc AANA was transferred to IISc library for getting the latest Scientific and Technical information useful to faculty and students.

Dr. Shenoy and Dr. Vasanthi visited IISc during Dec'2010 and met the librarian to have an update regarding their donation and promised to pool more donations from US.

MoU's with Universities:

With the help of alumni employed in Rice University an MoU between IISc and Rice University has been signed for exchange of faculty and students and for establishing scientific collaborations.

Gurumoorthy, Dasappa and S Mohan attended the meeting. Prof. S Mohan welcomed the Members, introduced them to Dr. Chidambaram and requested them to highlight their areas of expertise. Prof. B N Raghunandan explained Dr. Chidambaram about the activities that are being carried out in the area of Combustion. He also emphasized on the Joint Proposal submitted by IISc and IITM.

Prof. Dasappa and Prof. Sudhakar Rao briefed about the work being carried out in the area of Gasification.

Dr. R Chidambaram enquired about the steps taken to improve combustion in Biomass. Prof. Sitharam highlighted the activities of CISTUP.

He explained the various roles being taken up by CISTUP in coordination with Govt of Karnataka like inter-model transportation pushing for Commuter Rail and the studies being carried out around Bangalore City for Socio Economic and Techno Value. Prof. Mohan gave some examples of various programmes like B-Trac and Koyembedu Bus Terminus in Chennai.

Prof. Gurumoorthy and Dr. Anindya Deb explained about the Product Design activities that are being carried out in their department. Prof. Gurumoorthy said that they have submitted a proposal covering the areas such as Green management, Vision for fast inspection and Conventional manipulation for mesoscale techniques.

Dr. Chidambaram suggested to Prof. Sudhakar and Prof. Dasappa that funds are available under National Water Mission program. He also advised them to come out with the broad specifications including water contamination problems and asked them to be in touch with him for follow up.

Prof. Mohan thanked all the members for being present and Dr. Chidambaram was later taken for a tour to CISTUP.

SnT Run 2011



Indian Institute of Science hosted the third version of Science and Technology Run (SnT Run) on Sunday, 6th March, 2011. The event was jointly organized by the Students' Council and IISc Alumni Association. The participants in this event covered a wide spectrum ranging from the IISc fraternity and alumni, corporates from "Silicon Valley" of India, students from science and engineering colleges across Bangalore, to the local people who were enthusiastic about running for Science and Technology. The previous two editions in 2008 and 2010 were quite successful, witnessing a participation of over 1500 and this year's edition saw the number of participants cross 2000. Proceedings started with a welcome address by Dr K R Srinivasan, President IISc Alumni Association and convener of the SnT Run 2011. Guests of honour included names like athletes, Mrs Reeth Abraham, Mrs Ashwini Nachappa and Mr Najeeb Aga. Prof. P. Balaram, and Prof. N. Balakrishnan graced the occasion with their presence. The event was sponsored by IBM, GE, PRDC, Integramicro, Bharat Electronics, supported by Maini Group, Rajasthan Patrika and Bangalore Schools Sports Foundation. The rules and regulations and the technical part of the event was managed by Elvis Joseph from Bangalore Schools Sports Foundation. The events lined up this year were, a 10km mini-marathon, 5km Fun Run, Children's (<15>55 years of age) of 2km and a 5x1km corporate relay. The various categories of the runs were flagged off by the guests of honour.

The event went off as planned and was conducted in an almost perfect and glitch free manner. The event was well received by the



participants and there was no lack of enthusiasm in the crowd as was evident from the never ending applicants at the registration desk.

Students' Council thanks the innumerable volunteers for their selfless efforts and support that helped make sure that the event went off smoothly.

Special mention must be made of the efforts of the Environmental Initiatives Committee of the Students' Council and the associated volunteers who made sure that the littering on campus during the event was kept to a minimum. We can say with certainty that at the end of the event, we have left the campus in the same litter free state it was in at the start of the event. We thank the participants for adhering to the no littering rule and for making use of the dustbins placed at regular intervals.



A new concept introduced this year was the BoF Session (BoF – Birds of a Feather). Derived from the phrase "Birds of a feather flock together", BoF sessions involve informal discussion groups that are formed spontaneously. The participants with shared interests gather under a placard (stating their interest) and carry out discussions without any pre planned agenda. The aim of the BoF sessions this year was to provide an opportunity to outsiders to get to know the institute better by interacting with its students, alumni and faculty in a comfortable and relaxed environment. There were 3 BoF platforms namely – Students BoF (about courses in the institute, pursuing research in institutes of higher learning, BS programme at IISc), Corporate BoF (to discuss existing association of corporates with the institute, scope for future collaboration, continuing education programmes at the institute) and Alumni BoF (interaction between alumni and current IISc community). Prof Narahari (CSA) and Prof Iyer (MGMT) kindly volunteered to be present during the BoF sessions and we thank them for their invaluable advice and guidance during the discussions.

After the event, the feedback from the participants widely proclaimed the third edition of the SnT Run as a very well organized one.
